Measures high frequency absorption indicating the location of increased porosity and potential gas accumulations









MEMBERSHIP INFORMATION

ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP- In order to be eligible for active membership a person must (1) have a degree in geology or one of the earth sciences and be directly engaged in the application of Geology, or (2) presently engaged in or have been engaged in the application of geology or one of the earth sciences for the preceding five years. Any retired person qualified for active membership before retirement shall also qualify for active membership.

ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP- In order to be eligible for associate membership a person must be actively engaged in the geological or earth science work. An associate member shall not be eligible to vote or to hold selective office, but shall have all other rights and privileges enjoyed by active members. Associate members who attain eligibility for active membership may apply for transfer to active membership.

STUDENT MEMBERSHIP- Student membership shall be limited to those students who have completed two years of college and who are enrolled in geology or a related earth science in a recognized college or university granting degrees in earth sciences. A student member shall not be eligible to vote or to hold office, but shall have all other rights and privileges enjoyed by active members. Students have access to electronic bulletins only.

July 19, 1978 – Near Ripley, Mississippi – Field Notes.

It was decided that I could use my personal car for the Friday trip into the field because all of the available state trucks were checked out, and besides, the mileage and per diem reimbursements provided a small bump in pay to my minimum-wage summer job. The plan had been to visit a few Cretaceous outcrops notable for excellent and abundant fossil specimens. The prize from the Owl Creek Sand would be the ammonite, some the size of dinner platters, preserved in glory with its iridescent mother-of-pearl shell. The smothering humidity of a July afternoon in the

Mississippi woods pressed on me as I carefully dug into the soft brown earth with a shovel. My overseer and guide was the paleontologist well-acquainted with our objective. In classic Mississippi style, he supervised my work from outside the hole. If an onlooker had come upon us, it would have appeared that I might be the hapless victim of a capital crime in progress, digging my own grave in the woods.

No ammonites, but an impressive hole. At three feet down, something brightly colored slithered across the spade of the shovel. With a yelp, I bound out of the hole while the paleontologist bound in! Reaching down, digging with his hands, he emerged clutching a small, brightly colored snake with black, red, and milky yellow banding. The debate immediately ensued as


to the species of snake – was it indeed a coral snake or nature's trickery, the non-venomous banded milk snake? Let's see, black and yellow? Or was it red and yellow? We just couldn't recall the diagnostic rhyme. But, we decided to put the snake into a large geological sample sack and return to Jackson where someone smarter than us could identify the species. The snake was carefully inserted into the sack; the drawstring pulled tightly closed, and gently placed in the back seat of my car.

Upon our arrival in Jackson in the early evening, we unloaded the samples and tools. As I retrieved the sample bag containing the reptile, I noticed that it was surprisingly light. Pulling open the bag, it was empty! Horrified, we began a frantic but futile search. It was reasoned (not by me) that the snake not only found its way out of the bag, but ultimately out of the moving car. I would spend the rest of the weekend pulling apart the car and looking for the snake with no success. The event did, however, limit my family's interest in driving, borrowing, or catching a ride in my car for quite some time.
